Contemplations of your President

Autumn is upon us and I fear winter is close behind. I bought a new snow blower and hope that will be insurance enough to keep us from getting any major storms. After 30 years in our house, we finally decide to add a 2 car detached garage (the one in the house was converted to a room last year) and redo the driveway to direct run-off to the side. The result is about twice the driveway surface area and an excuse for a new snow blower. The garage has an upstairs storage space so we are busily moving unneeded items from the house.

I am now officially retired. I signed up for Social Security and Medicare a couple of months back and I just received my first Social Security direct deposit. If you read the minutes of the director's meeting, you will see that we have been forced to increase the annual publication fee from \$5.00 to \$10.00. We hesitated to do this knowing that many of you are on fixed incomes, but it costs almost \$10.00 to prepare and mail the publications each year. While we are not here to make a profit (and we certainly do not), we at least need to cover expenses. Last year we had to increase the annual and family dues for the same reason and we hope you will understand.

As you may or may not know, the JFA has an endowment of \$20,000 which was willed to us about 10 years ago. The decision at that time was to invest the money and only use the income, which we have from time to time. Over the last several years, we have been looking for a way to use this money more productively and it has been suggested that we use some of it to restore some of the JFA relevant headstones in the Rowley cemetery which are in poor condition. Barbara Shaw has been investigating this and we hope to have some options available for review at the reunion.

The teleconference meeting was called to order at 12:04 pm

Old Business:

The Minutes of 2008 meeting were mailed to the directors prior to the meeting for review. The only change which needed to be made to the minutes was to add Cecilia McGehee to the roster of attendees.

The Treasurer's Report was also sent to the directors ahead of time for their review. Mary Gorball moved to accept both the minutes as amended and the Treasurer's Report. Dorothy Brigham seconded and the motion was approved by the Board.

Carrie Cole gave the Historian's Report. She said she was a bit behind due to illness but has been catching up. Carrie suggested writing a note up for the quarterly on how people can find out information when Carrie is not able to help out.

Tom Jewett gave the Editor's report. He stated that he expected to have quarterly four ready to go to the printer shortly after Thanksgiving.

There was an update to the status on the Headstone Photo Album given by Barbara Shaw and Bernice Mansir. Barbara asked if we should use Blurb.com ourselves or if we should send it out to someone else. Ted replied that we would need to make the book ourselves and that when she has all the information, she can contact him or Johanna for help. Barbara said she has a niece that might be able to help as well, since she has an interest in Jewett genealogy. Carrie suggested that if Barbara scanned the photos and email them to her, she could then keep hard copies of them.

Barbara Shaw reported on the status of the Rowley Cemetery Restoration. We can donate to the perpetual care of the cemetery which would go towards the mowing and maintenance. They do not do stone cleaning or restoration, but gave her the number of someone who could do so, if that is our choice. Mary Gorball suggested that we focus our donation on restoration rather than the perpetual care, as that seems will funded already. Ted said we should find out how much it would be per stone to restore and then focus on the stones that are the oldest and of direct lineage. Barbara said she would contact them about pricing. Jeff suggested finding out the credentials of the restoration company before selecting them for the job.

New Business:

Ted proposed that the family give \$200 in grants to each of the following: Rowley, Grandview and Oberlin. Dorothy made a motion, Barbara Shaw seconded it and the Board approved the three \$200 grants for this year.

Ted asked if anyone would be on a committee to investigate for the 2010 reunion. Jeff volunteered to help and Johanna and Carrie said they would be willing to help out with the physical reunion prep such as food, shopping and setup. Ted suggested that we postpone the reunion for another year and see if we can cultivate interest for a reunion. There was another suggestion to just set a date and then see if there is interest. Ted asked Dorothy to look for other activities /events in the Rowley area that would be going on during the same time as the reunion (August 2010). Dorothy volunteered to be on the committee. She will contact the church and look for local activities. There was a suggestion to have someone speak about headstone restoration at the reunion. Ted, Dorothy and Jeff will talk some more and give their recommendations.

Ted proposed that we increase the yearly publication fee from \$5 to \$10 since the cost for all the mailings and postage now is about at \$10. Ted made a motion for the increase in publication fee. It was seconded and approved by the Board.

The board had discussed earlier in the meeting that we could use the endowment for stone restoration at the Rowley Cemetery.



He graduated Summa Cum Laude from the University of South Florida-Tampa with a degree in special education in 1976, receiving the Outstanding Graduate Student Award and Outstanding Senior Leader Award. He received his Masters in Education from Texas Southern University, Houston, TX. Bob began his career in education 33 years ago as a teacher with the Houston Independent School District, Austin High School. He later became a special education teacher in the Alief ISD and was quickly named as Assistant Principal for Martin Elementary School. Bob opened three Alief ISD schools in five years: Sneed Elementary (1990), Kerr High School (1993), and Klentzman Intermediate School (1995). In 1995, Bob joined Stetson and Associates, an educational consulting firm as an educational consultant. Arthur “Bluie” Jewett, a mass of Christian Burial for Arthur “Bluie” Jewett of White Horse, SD. Was held at 10 a.m. Friday, September 25, 2009 at the Eagle Butte Gym. Burial will be at St. Therese’s Catholic Cemetery in White Horse under the direction of the Kesling Funeral Home of Mobridge. An all night wake will be held on Thursday with a prayer service at 7 p.m. at the All Saints Catholic Church in Eagle Butte. Family and friends will be meeting at the 4 mile junction at 5:30 p.m. Mr. Jewett was killed in action during the Korean War. His family recently received word that his remains had been identified and would be returned for burial. Arthur F. Jewett was born August 26, 1928 to George and Keva (Rousseau) Jewett on Jewett Creek east of White Horse. He was the fourth of ten children. A twin, Arthur was gifted a blue blanket at birth. His brother, Albert, was given a pink blanket. From then on, Arthur was known as “Bluie” and Albert became known as “Pinky.” Bluie grew up around Jewett Creek. He attended school in White Horse and Stephan. As a youth, he enjoyed hunting, fishing and playing basketball. He also helped on the family ranch taking care of cattle and putting up hay. Following graduation, Bluie joined the United States Army and was stationed in San Francisco, CA. Not long after arriving in San Francisco, he received orders that sent him to Japan, and eventually, to Korea. At the time of his death, Bluie was a member of Company B, 1st Battalion, 32 Infantry Regiment and 7th Infantry Division. Although the exact date is unknown, Bluie lost his life between November 23 and December 2, 1950 in a battle later known as the Chosin Reservoir Campaign. On January 13, 1951 his parents, George and Keva, received word that Bluie had been declared “Missing-In-Action.” Up until that point, they had not heard from Bluie or received any messages in almost six weeks. On January 4, 1954 the Army awarded Bluie the Purple Heart for his sacrifice. Bluie’s parents and siblings greatly mourned his passing. The unknown circumstances of his death and “missing” status haunted his parents and siblings throughout their lives. Bluie is survived by his brother, Louis M. Jewett of White Horse; sisters Julia (Gib) Marshall of Eagle Butte and Juanita (Jim) Gable of Buford, GA; sisters-in-law, Mary Jewett and Candace Jewett, both of White Horse; and many nieces and nephews. In addition to his parents, Bluie was followed in death by three sisters— Corrine (husband Larry Mendoza), Iyonne, (husband Ellsworth Garreau), and Ramona Jewett, as well as three brothers— Orlin Jewett (wife Kay), Albert “Pinky” Jewett, and Keith Jewett. Casketbearers are Keith Jewett, Shannon Jewett, Wendy Luce, Michael Ducheneaux, Albert Jewett, Marcel Jewett, Wayne Garreau, and Larry Mendoza. Wells Jewett, (#23,292) 90, a longtime resident of Deephaven, Minn. and Green Valley, died on Sept. 23, 2009. JEWETT FAMILY ANNUAL REUNION

The 86th annual reunion of the descendants of Nathan Rodney and Agnes Silome VanHousen Jewett was held at Highland Park, Endicott, NY, on Sunday August 2nd, 2009. The 57 persons in attendance included members Marie Coil Oakley (25,100) and Josephine Jewett Dillon (25,106). These two women had attended the 1st reunion in 1924. Josephine announced that the Susquehanna County Historical Society and Free Library Association in her hometown of Montrose, PA will be sponsoring the reading this fall of a book titled “My Antonia”, by Willa Cather. This book reading is promoted as part of “The Big Read” which is a program funded by a Pennsylvania Humanities Council grant. It is of note that Ms. Cather was a contemporary of Sarah Orne Jewett, who lived from 1849 to 1909.

Sarah Orne Jewett was also an author, and one of her books, “Best Stories of Sarah Orne Jewett” contains a quote from Willa Cather. Ms. Cather indicated that Ms. Jewett’s stories were “almost flawless examples of literary art”. Ms. Jewett was recognized as one of the foremost American writers of the nineteenth century. She was noted to have influenced a number of writers, including Willa Cather.

Sarah Orne Jewett was the daughter of Caroline Frances Perry and Theodore Herman Jewett, a physician. Because she accompanied her father on many house calls, she learned about the residents of the area. He also taught her much about the local vegetation. Her works reflect a detailed knowledge of New England plants and herbs. As a child, Sarah was described as something of a “maverick”. Her works are known for her individual voice and determination to forge a way of her own.

Sarah’s manuscripts, correspondence, and much of her library were bequeathed to the Houghton Library at Harvard, where they remain. There are also substantial collections of Jewett materials at the society for the Preservation of New England Antiquities in Boston and at the Colby College Library in Waterville, Maine.

The library in Montrose, PA has a historical society with an active genealogy department. William Wayne Nash (25,109) has presented the library with a complete set of the History and Genealogy of the Jewetts of America. Josephine Jewett Dillon contributes her copies of the Quarterly Newsletter to the Historical Society. The website for the library in Montrose, PA is www.susqcolibrary.org/bigread.
